## SCHOLARSHIP NEWS

Kathy Cowles and I have interviewed several students on the CPCC Campus twice this summer. These applicants fit the criteria set by the Mint Hill Women's Club and were screened by the Financial Aid Department at CPCC as having a definite financial need.



We are please to announce that we are awarding three \$1,000.00 scholarships for the 2009-2010school year. CPCC will award \$500.00 to each recipient for the fall semester and \$500.00 for the spring semester. The winners are:

- Oksana Malkova – Oksana came to the United States from the Ukraine with her family as religious exiles. She came here three years ago and did not know any English. She graduated from Independence this June with a 3.5 GPA. She was able to matriculate into the mainstream population at Independence from the ESL program after only two years. Oksana is enrolled at the Levine Campus in a College Prep program with hopes to transfer after two years and complete her studies in International Business/Marketing.
  
- Homar Gonzalez – Homar will be the first person in his family to attend college. He also graduated from Independence this June with a 3.5 GPA. Homar was in a very serious automobile accident with his family 3 years ago while visiting in Mexico. His family suffered great financial losses as a result of this accident which he told us was a “wake-up call to him” to buckle down, study and make something of himself. Homas is enrolled in the Main Campus of CPCC in a College Prep program with hopes to transfer and pursue a Medical career.
  
- Janet Orr – Janet is a 42 year old wife and mother who realized that without a college education, she could not advance far in life. She began her studies at CPCC in 2007. She has worked a fulltime job and attended classes at night so far accumulating 38 college hours. She has now been accepted into the Dental Assisting program and will be going to school full time, but will continue working part time as well. Once she completes the Dental Assisting program, she hopes to go to work in a dental office and then continue her education to perhaps one day go into teaching.

Kathy and I feel VERY good about these three individuals and feel that the Mint Hill Scholarship funds will make a HUGE impact on all of them.
